Absolutism, Constitutionalism and the Failure of Liberalism in Portugal

The forty-year period from 1810 to 1850 saw numerous changes in the governance of Portugal although the monarch still played a central role in the political life of the period. Against a background of dynastic struggle, Portugal changed from an absolute to a constitutional monarchy and in fact there were three different constitutions within the period. The talk will outline the dynastic conflict between Dom Pedro and Dom Miguel (The War of the Two Brothers), as well as the attempts by liberal elements to create a liberal state. This lecture will explain why in the end Portugal continued as a very conservative country in which the liberals were relegated to the cafés and debating clubs (including the cortes) of Lisbon and Porto.
