The Peninsular War: The Battles of Fuentes de Oñoro and Albuera

During the winter of 1810-11, Viscount Wellington lived at Palácio dos Marqueses da Fronteira in Benfica. He was well rested for the chase in Spring 1811 as Masséna's starving Armée de Portugal traipsed back over the border to Ciudad Rodrigo, leaving a trail of cruelty and destruction behind them. As the French tried to wrest the initiative back from Wellington, two desperate contests followed: at Fuentes de Oñoro, Wellington remarked that if Boney had been there, the Anglo-Portuguese would have lost; and at Albuera, Beresford's army staved off defeat only because a divisional commander took the initiative.

1811 was a close run year, but pivotal in the struggle in the Peninsula. Peter Booker takes the narrative forward a year in preparation for unlocking the doors to Spain at Ciudad Rodrigo and Badajoz. FUENTES DE OÑORO AND ALBUERA PETER KINGDON BOOKER
