Carmen was born in Puerto Rico, which is located in the northeastern Caribbean. When she was young her family moved to New York. There she studied Fashion Design and Illustration. She studied at the School of Visual Arts on E23rd Street and the Parsons School of Design on W12th. Her speciality is portrait painting.

In 2009 Carmen's daughter gave her some books on the Indigenous People of the Western Hemisphere. These books contained the documented history of Native American Indians and sepia photographs taken by Edward Sheriff Curtiss in 1885. His photographs show the dignity, loss, sadness, mistrust and curiosity of these people.

These photos and the stories of the people touched my soul said Carmen. And when she paints these portraits she concentrates on the expressions and their eye because they mirror their soul. She plans to keep those people alive through her paintings. She plans a series of exhibitions which she stresses will be informative and provocative.

Today the descendants of the tribes have been formally educated and many have become attorneys fighting in the courts trying to retrieve what has been lost, including their dignity, Nativwe American Indians are renowned for their bridge building abilities. Casinos are also a source of income.
