Beautiful Gardens with Little Water Marilyn Medina Ribeiro has degrees in Graphic Design and Landscape Management and has worked in nurseries, parks and private gardens. In 2008, she moved to the Algarve, managing hotel gardens and later founding her own company to promote sustainable land management. Waterwise Gardens works throughout the Algarve, undertaking projects of all shapes and sizes, from new builds and landscape management planning to tweaks and renovations of existing gardens, always with an eye for the most appropriate plants to create gardens that are beautiful, economical and sustainable. In her presentation, Marilyn will explain her philosophy in greater depth and how this applies in particular to gardening in the Mediterranean climate. By choosing from the vast range of Mediterranean-climate native plants (more than 70,000 species in all), there are almost limitless possibilities for creating gardens with little or no supplementary irrigation, all of them a far cry from the "brown and spiky" image that many people still harbour in their mind's eye. Marilyn will take us on a visual journey through some ravishing gardens and landscapes, showcasing just what is possible when we choose the right plants for the right place.

The Canning Industry in the Algarve

Always a tuna fishing coast, the Algarve had preserved its catch in salt. The advent of new means for preservation of food in tins in the second half of the 19th century saw a massive swing towards canning. The change began in VRSA and spread along the coast as far as Lagos. In the 1960s and 1970s, this phenomenon disappeared as quickly as it had arrived as a result of the decline in tuna catches and the advent of industrial scale freezing. The skeletons of the industry in the major towns of the Algarve demonstrate that in its time, canning was perhaps the major industry of the Algarve. UPCOMING EVENT on Sunday 10 April at 16h00, Municipal Library, Tavira - The Passionate Pilgrim

Based on fact and set in medieval Portugal, *The Passionate Pilgrim* is a tragicomic drama where miracles of healing and supernatural apparitions take centre stage. A paragon of English virtue and Queen of Portugal for almost 30 years, **Philippa of Lancaster** was married to Dom Joao I. They were parents of six surviving children – the so-called Illustrious Generation – including the much talked about Prince Henry the Navigator. Using recent research, the author investigates the intimate

personal life of the Prince and the androgyny of a cleric who sells papal indulgences. Like Chaucer's Pardoner, this droll character illustrates aspects of corruption in the medieval church. Parodying the pilgrims in the Canterbury Tales, the Queen leads a group of courtly ladies to the hallowed city of Santiago de Compostela, one of the most important religious sites in the medieval world. Bizarre events, blind faith and love of the Almighty shape the journey with comic and sometimes ludicrous results. Filled with risqué lines, burlesque characters and factual information, 'The Passionate Pilgrim' is beautifully staged and costumed and enacted by a cast of eleven. 'The Passionate Pilgrim' is written entirely in rhyme by Carolyn Kain whose previous plays include 'The Rhyming Diary of Mrs Pepys' and 'Rags to Riches.'
